The programs highlighted below have both received a grant from CIF's Summer Grant Program. Summer Grants are intended to support activities and programs for children and youth that occur between May 1 and August 31. The types of projects typically supported include summer camps and day programming during the summer months that offer positive recreation, arts, culture and learning opportunities.

Feature Story: Summer Fun Program, Town of Allan

The Allan Summer Fun Program is a summer program for children aged five to twelve with a focus on mental growth, physical activity, and healthy lifestyles. "Keeping the children and youth engaged in our community by providing quality recreation and active methods of mental development was the primary goal of the program" shared Lindsay Nordmarken, Recreation Director.

Themed weeks such as team sports, nutrition, arts and crafts, and water sports provided many different opportunities for kids to try new activities and meet new friends. Participants in the program also received daily nutritional snacks. Two high school students gained valuable work experience through summer jobs as 'play leaders,' assisting and participating in the activities with the children. A university student was also employed as the program coordinator.
